From the Office of Principal Tom Gwin

I am happy to report that WHS is finally catching up to the electronic age in our ongoing efforts to improve communication between families and the school. For the first time, report cards were emailed home to families that had indicated that they were willing to receive electronic report cards. Over 500 electronic report cards were sent, saving WHS over \$200 in postal costs. Since the mailing, 100 more families have given us permission to email report cards. If you would like to be added to the list, please email my administrative assistant, Mia Gustin at mgustin@winchester.k12.ma.us. With this new email capability, I will be able to send a bulk email to parents or students without depending on the PFA's email program.

In addition, WHS is piloting the use of Edline, an online service that will serve as an extension to our school's website. Edline will improve communication between parents, students, and teachers in a safe, secure online environment. With Edline, students and parents know what's going in school- from activities to your student's latest exam score. You will be able to check on grades, school news, assignments, calendars, and more.

Edline is being piloted by a few math teachers. The students in these classes have a personal activation code that allows them to check their math grades online. So far, the students really love this new capability as it allows them to know where they stand in class. Using the new email feature, we will be sending home parent activation codes so you too can access Edline. Each staff member, parent, and student will have his or her own screen name (login) and password allowing them access to the WHS Edline site. If your son or daughter is in one of the math pilots, you will be able to check their math grades. If not, you will still be able to access WHS information on the Edline website. As the year progresses, I expect more teachers will be using Edline grade reporting feature with their classes.

As we move into the snow season, the school district will be moving to an emergency notification system called School Messenger. When school will be cancelled or important information needs to go out, the superintendent will be able to record a message that will go out to all families in the district within minutes. When the phone rings on a snowy morning, the kids will know that they can stay in bed. Principals will have the capability to send a recorded message to their staff or parent body. The new communication system should be in place sometime in December so stay tuned for details.

Town Meeting approved the funding of \$1.35 million for Phase I of the Comprehensive Field Restoration Plan. Phase I includes a new synthetic turf, multi-sport playing field at Manchester Field. Our football, soccer, field hockey, and lacrosse teams will be able to play at this site. Phase I also includes new 800-seat bleachers on the hill adjacent to the field and a new baseball diamond at Lynch Field (relocated from Manchester). It is hoped that the new turf field will be ready for the Thanksgiving Day football game in 2009. The entire project also includes a new eight-lane track with a natural sod field at Manchester Field, and a renovated baseball diamond and three renovated playing fields at Ciarcia. Fundraising will finance Phase II of the project. At long last, the football and track teams will be able to host home events.

The PFA Grants are by far the largest line item in our budget, returning the bulk of your Direct Appeal donations directly to the students and teachers of Winchester High to meet critical needs and support new initiatives. The grants make a real difference in the daily lives of both students and faculty, from funding the purchase of innovative "smart boards" for our math classrooms to buying hot chocolate supplies to keep the library "warm" for our hard-working students. Junior Parent College Night Scheduled for January 20

The Guidance Department's Early College Planning Night for parents of juniors has been scheduled for Tuesday evening, January 20, 2009, at 7:00 P.M. The program will be held in the auditorium and will feature speakers David Hautanen, Director of Undergraduate Admissions and Recruitment, Northeastern University, and Walker Coppedge, Associate Director of Undergraduate Admissions, Tufts University. These admissions professionals will describe the admissions process from the colleges' perspective. Guidance Director Sherri Lewis-Sholler will discuss how to get started on the college selection process, with an emphasis on how to begin the college search, what to look for when visiting colleges, and a suggested schedule for college admissions testing. The Early College Planning Night is the first in a series of workshops designed to equip parents with as much information as possible about the college process. **Juniors are welcome to attend this workshop with their parents.**

Guidance Department to Host Morning Program for Parents of Sophomores

On Wednesday, January 21, 2009, the Guidance Department will hold a morning program for parents of sophomores from 9:00 – 10:00 AM. The focus will be on how to use the PSAT/NMSQT Score Reports and a suggested schedule for further testing in high school. Important Information for Parents of Seniors

During the senior year, when a student requests that his/her transcript be sent to a college, the transcript of the first three years is sent to colleges. In February, after mid-year report cards have been issued, a copy of the semester report card is automatically sent to all colleges to which a senior has applied. The report cards sent to the colleges are copies of the report cards sent to parents, except that teachers' comments have been deleted. Parents or students who have questions concerning this information may contact Sherri Lewis-Sholler, Guidance Director.

PSAT/NMSQT Score Reports to be Mailed in December

The Guidance Department will be mailing PSAT/NMSQT score reports to students and parents in December, as soon as they are received from the College Board. Due to the high cost of mailing, however, **students' individual test booklets must be picked up in the Guidance Office.** By using the test booklet along with the score report, students will be able to identify areas of weakness to review and practice for the SAT. All high school students who took the 2008 PSAT/NMSQT will receive access to My College QuickStart, without charge. My College QuickStart will provide students with the opportunity for projecting their SAT score ranges, customizing an SAT study plan, and other college planning features. Directions for accessing My College QuickStart will be included with the PSAT Score Reports.

Harvard Offers Lowell Scholarship Program for Courses at Extension School

Each year for the past 21 years, Harvard Extension School has offered Lowell Scholarships to qualified high school students to enable them to take one course per term at half tuition, provided the course is taken for credit and the student meets the course prerequisites. Financial Aid Workshop

The W.H.S. Guidance Department is holding a Financial Aid Workshop for parents of seniors on **Tuesday, December 2, 2008, at 7:00 P.M. in the auditorium.** Liz Bassett, Associate Director of Financial Aid at Suffolk University, and an educational loan representative from a local bank will present the program. Ms. Bassett will provide step-by-step instructions on completing the Free Application for Federal Student Assistance (FAFSA), the form required to apply for all types of financial aid. She will also present information on the *Profile* form required by many private institutions, in addition to the FAFSA. The bank representative will explain the various educational loan programs. A representative from the Winchester Scholarship Foundation will present information on how to apply for scholarships from the WSF, and WSF applications will be available. Students are welcome to attend this informative workshop with their parents.

A second financial aid night will be held for parents of juniors on January 27, 2009 at 7:00 pm in the auditorium. A representative from College Funding Services will present information about various ways to finance your child's college education. Senior parents are also welcome to attend.

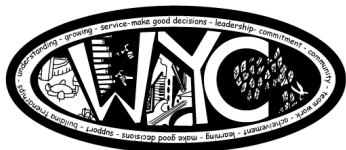

A message from the Superintendent concerning school closing or delayed opening, due to inclement weather.

In addition to the possibility of closing schools due to inclement weather, we may also use a delayed opening. In order to ensure greater safety, the opening of schools may be delayed up to two hours. Be sure to listen to the no school announcements.

If there is a delay in the start of school due to inclement weather there will be NO MORNING PRESCHOOL classes. The other preschool programs will follow the time delay as indicated for the rest of the district.

Should there be a delayed opening, students will be expected to go to their bus stop or to leave their houses (if they walk to school) one (or two) hours after their regularly scheduled time. The bus company and crossing guards will know about the delay and will rearrange their schedules accordingly.

The quickest way to determine whether school will be closed or the opening delayed due to bad weather is to listen to your radio or television. **Please do not call the police, fire or school officials.** This only ties up telephone lines and disrupts attempts to plan for or respond to emergencies.

Every effort will be made to call in "No School" announcements to the following radio stations and television channels before 6:00 a.m.

WBZ – Channel 4	WinCam – Channel 9
WCVB – Channel 5	www.winchester.k12.ma.us
WHDH – Channel 7	Click link for School Cancellation Notification
WFXT – FOX 25	

If the announcement is not on the radio the previous evening, the decision has not yet been made. Normally, the decision is not made until the early morning hours of the day in question.

The decision to close or delay the opening of school is made by the Superintendent of Schools. This decision is based upon the best information available on street and weather conditions from the Police Department, Public Works Department and the U.S. Weather Bureau, at the time the decision must be made, usually before 5:30 a.m. However, it may be necessary where the decision has to be made after that. Weather conditions do change sometimes, for better or for worse, but our intent is to determine that it is reasonably safe for students and staff to attend school.

If school is held, but conditions are still very bad on any particular street or area in town, parents are urged to use their own judgment in determining whether or not to send a student to school. A student will not be marked absent in such a case.

If a storm occurs during a school day, school will ordinarily remain in session. We are advised by the Police Department that once students are in school they are better off remaining there than being released early because of a storm. The reasons for this include: the Town has more time to service major accesses to and from schools prior to dismissal and parents of many younger children may not be home to receive them. However, parents should also make certain that their child knows where to go, in the event schools have to be dismissed early. Early dismissals, should they occur, will also be broadcast in advance over the referenced radio and television stations.

Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated. The safety of the children will always be our prime consideration.
