From the Office of Principal Tom Gwin

In the November, 2008 newsletter I wrote that Town Meeting had approved the funding of \$1.35 million for Phase 1 of the Manchester Field Restoration Project. Phase 1 included a new synthetic turf, multi-sport playing field at Manchester Field and new 800-seat bleachers on the hill adjacent to the field. I also wrote, "It is hoped that the field will be ready for the Thanksgiving Day football game in 2009." I am very pleased to report that Phase 1 will be complete in early November and the Winchester High football team will play Woburn High on Turkey Day! We may even see some post season play on the new field for our playoff bound fall varsity teams. I would like to thank Athletic Director Brian Carroll for spearheading the effort for this project, and the Winchester Field Development Council (WFDC) for securing over \$240,000 in private funds to complete Phase 1. The high school community is delighted that our students will have a state-of-the-art facility to host home competitions.

With construction of Phase 1 almost complete, the WFDC is focusing its efforts on raising private funds for Phase 2 of the project. Phase 2 includes a new eight-lane track with a natural sod field at Manchester Field. The high school has been without a track facility and has not hosted a home track meet in years. Check out the WFDC's website <http://www.wfdc.net/> to see how you can contribute to the project. The WFDC will also host an Autumn Auction fundraiser on Saturday, November 14, 7 pm at Town Hall. You can purchase tickets for this event on the website. The Thanksgiving Day game should be a fantastic event and I hope to see you there!

The Winchester Coalition for a Safer Community (formerly the Substance Abuse Coalition) is hosting an Evening with Michael Fowlin on Monday, November 16 at 7:30 pm in the WHS auditorium. Dr. Fowlin will present an exciting program on the issues of race, discrimination, violence prevention, personal identity, and inclusion. Dr. Fowlin performed at McCall last year and received rave reviews. The sophomores and juniors will see Dr. Fowlin's performance on November 17. SAVE THE NEW DATE/RESERVED SEATING FOR: MICHAEL FOWLIN RETURNING TO WINCHESTER

After rave reviews last year from students, teachers and parents alike, the Winchester Public Schools is pleased to announce the return of nationally recognized clinical psychologist and actor, Dr. Michael Fowlin. On November 16 and 17, Dr. Fowlin will be presenting leveled programs to grades 3-5, 6th and 10-11th, as well as a *performance for all Winchester parents on the evening of Monday, November 16th at 7:00 pm at the High School Auditorium.* (The evening performance was previously announced as happening on Tuesday, November 17th, so be sure to note the change of date.)

Dr. Michael Fowlin, better known as Mykee, is no stranger to the stage. He has been formally acting since age 11, but started creating voices (via prank calling) at age 9. In addition to his talents on stage, he has an undergraduate degree in psychology from Evangel University, in Springfield, Missouri, and in the fall of 2001, he attained a doctorate degree in clinical psychology from Rutgers University. Oddly enough, he suffers from delusions of grandeur, for, while performing, he is convinced that every audience member is his patient.

His programs combine both his professional acting talents and his psychological training. His mission is to create an atmosphere of worldwide inclusion, not just tolerance, towards all people. He has worked extensively with all age groups in the United States and in other countries. His work has included peer mediation, diversity trainings, gender equity workshops, and violence prevention seminars.

Last year, over 300 parents attended his evening performance. Given the parental enthusiasm for his programs, and the impact we saw after his presentation to the McCall Middle School last year, we expect a very heavy turnout for the evening presentation. **Seating in the high school auditorium is limited; reserved seating for the parent's session on Monday evening November 16th is available until November 13th by emailing Enrichment Coordinator Anne Marie Hill at hill.davis@comcast.net, with the subject line "Michael Fowlin."**

Plan Now for Free College Goal Sunday

College Goal Sunday is a volunteer-driven effort to provide free assistance to students and families in completing the Free Application for Federal Student Assistance (FAFSA). The program is supported and administered by a volunteer committee comprised of members of the Massachusetts Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (MASFAA). College Goal Sunday workshops will be held at 17 locations across the state. To learn more about how to participate, go to: www.MassCollegeGoalSunday.org. This includes specific information about current site locations, coordinator contact information and site directions.

NCAA Eligibility

High school athletes who would like to participate in any sport at an NCAA Division I or II school must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse. Eligibility requirements change from year to year, but the current requirements are 16 core courses in the following areas:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Mathematics (Algebra I or higher)
- 2 years of natural/physical science, including one lab
- 1 additional year of English, Math or Science
- 2 years of Social Studies
- 4 years of additional core courses from any of the areas mentioned above, or from foreign language, non-doctrinal religion, or philosophy.

It is the student-athlete's responsibility to register with the Clearinghouse, preferably during their junior year. Students may register and obtain additional information on the Web at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net.

Start the Financial Aid Process...Get Your PIN

Although the Free Application for Federal Student Assistance (FAFSA) cannot be filed until after January 1, 2010, seniors and their parents planning to apply for financial aid can get a **PIN** (Personal Identification Number) now which will be used to electronically sign the **FAFSA** when completing and filing the application online. Applying for a **PIN** now will avoid holding up the process of filing the **FAFSA** online after January 1, since it takes 7-10 days to receive the **PIN** by mail. To obtain a **PIN**, students will need to supply their name, social security number, date of birth and mailing address and submit the **PIN** request. Parents of a dependent student must also request a **PIN**, since both parent and student must sign the **FAFSA**. To obtain the **PIN**, go to: www.pin.ed.gov.

MIT's Splash Weekend

The weekend before Thanksgiving is known as "Splash Weekend" at MIT, an event that has taken place every year since 1988. This year Splash Weekend will be held on November 21 & 22, 2009. It is expected that over one thousand high school and middle school students will converge on the MIT campus where MIT students and other local college students teach lectures, workshops and seminars on everything from Duct Tape Design to Algebraic Number Theory to Harry Potter. This year Splash online registration will open around November 1 and is available until Splash Weekend. Out-of-State Tuition Break Through RSP

The New England Board of Higher Education's (NEBHE) Regional Student Program (RSP) gives thousands of New England college students a significant out-of-state tuition break each year when they enroll in approved degree programs at out-of-state public colleges and universities in Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont. Through the RSP, the New England states cooperate to share academic programs offered by their public higher education institutions and provide eligible New England residents with a tuition break when they pursue approved programs not offered by their home-state public colleges and universities. The NEBHE website www.nebhe.org features comprehensive RSP information.

New College Financing Tool

The U.S. Department of Education has announced a new online tool to help students and families financially prepare for college before a student's senior year of high school. The **FAFSA4caster** provides parents with an early estimate of their eligibility for federal student aid, including grants, reduces the time it will take to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Assistance) and clarifies the financial aid process for students and parents. Please be sure to adhere to the Guidance Office Deadlines when requesting transcripts. In order for transcripts to reach colleges on time, it is critical that the Transcript Request Forms be submitted by the specified deadline.

The Winchester Coalition for a Safer Community would like you to know about a 2009 Youth Risk Behavior Survey: This year the Youth Risk Behavior Survey will be administered to grades 6-12 in November as approved by the school committee. There will be a **Parents Informational Meeting October 26th at 7:00 p. m. in the McCall Library**. This will be an opportunity to ask questions with regard to content, logistics and the impact the data has had on school and town initiatives. Parents who have previously had children participate in the survey will also be on hand to answer questions. Parents/Guardians who have questions or concerns with regard to their child's participation can also view the survey online on the Winchester School District Home Page. Parents/Guardians are also welcome to see the survey at the Superintendent's Office, McCall, WHS or the Winchester Board of Health office.

The Dandelion Project: An Evening of Sharing

Come to the Social Studies Department on Thursday evening, November 5th from 7 to 8 in the evening and learn about the Dandelion Project from students and teachers who traveled there last summer. The Dandelion Project is a program begun four years ago by Margie Harvey, the Director of Social Studies. In this program, students prepare English lessons in anticipation of their trip to China at the end of the school year. In the past, students have left Winchester the day school ends and headed for China. They stay at the Dandelion School for one week during their trip, teaching English to middle school children at this school. This school is special in that it was founded a little more than five years ago by Ms. Hong Zheng to educate the children of migrant workers living in the Beijing area. In addition to living and teaching at this school for one week, students travel in Beijing and Xian, visiting important historic and cultural sites in both cities.
